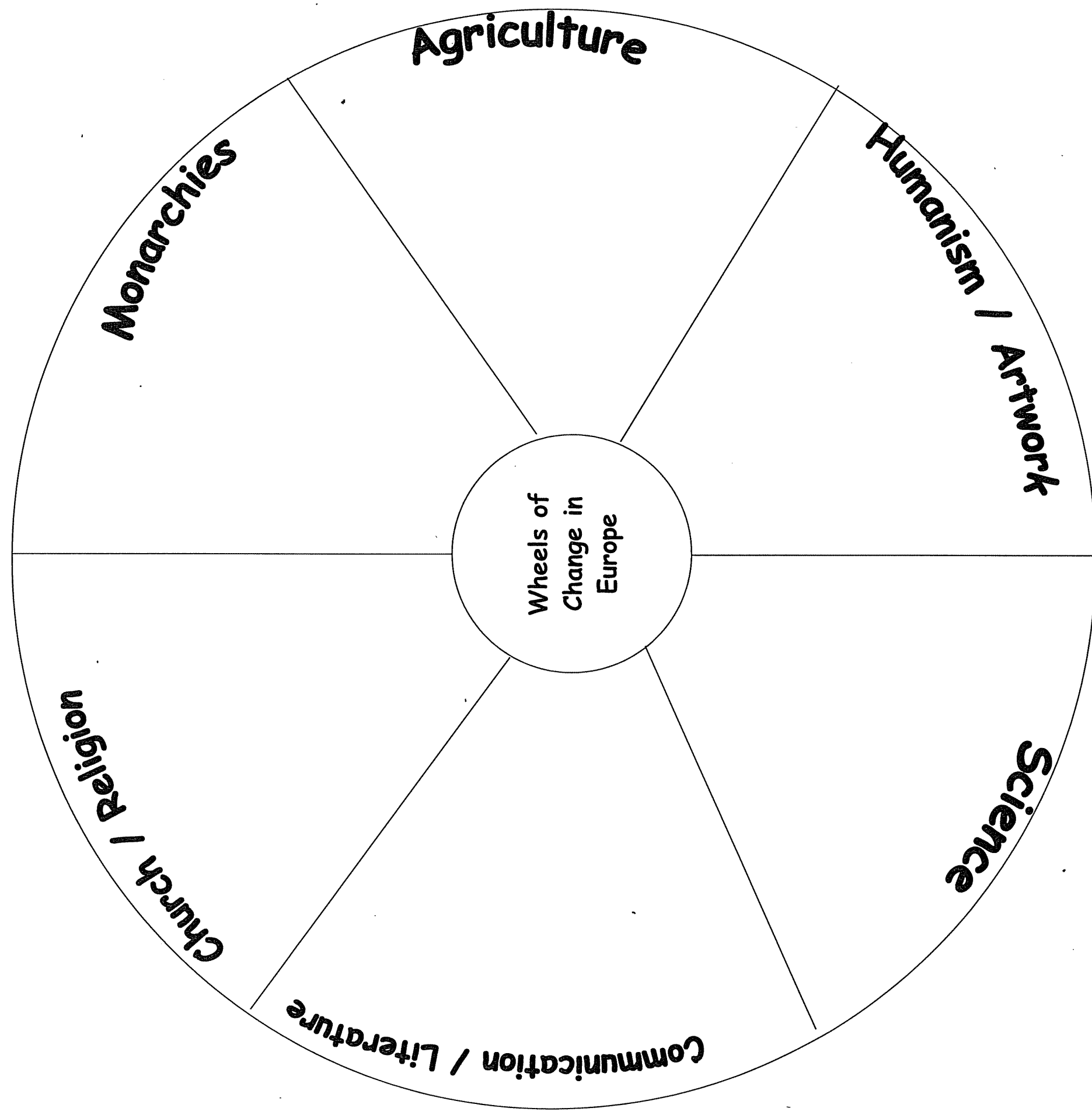


A Wheel of Change for Europe

As you learned in Grade 8, by the year 1500 Europe was beginning to experience profound changes politically, socially, economically, scientifically, and religiously. Life was moving away from the practices of the Middle Ages as Europe experienced a "rebirth" or "awakening" that became known as the Renaissance.
